They were seated on the stage, which was decorated with a large tree, and joined us in singing carols before one of our faculty members, dressed as Santa, distributed gifts. Funds to purchase the gifts were raised through the generosity of our students and purchased by our Student Council. Perhaps our generosity stemmed from our parents who had taught us to reach out to those less fortunate than ourselves; regardless, most of us probably recall how our hearts were lighter as a result of those gifts to children in need.

It was in that spirit, last Christmas, that the Westport Gals decided to seek a family in need, one to whom we could make a donation that would lighten their financial burden during the holiday season. However, we also have faith that Westporters, from primarily middle-income families, still care about those less fortunate.
